The Free State Foundation will hold a policy seminar, "**Implementing Real Regulatory Reform at the FCC**," on July 28, from 11:45 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. **FCC Commissioner Michael O'Rielly** will deliver a Keynote Address discussing a series of thoughtful, innovative proposals he has offered to reform the FCC's regulatory process.

In his [blog posts](#), **Commissioner O'Rielly** has suggested process reforms that include advance posting of items to be considered at FCC Sunshine meetings; changes to the Commission's use of advisory committees; changes to the practice of granting "editorial privileges" that allow the staff to revise items after Commission votes; controls on the use of "delegated authority" by the staff; initiation of a meaningful process for retrospective review of agency regulations; and others.
